One of the earliest Oregon State Society DAR markers can be found at Multnomah Falls. The marker was dedicated in 1916 honoring early pioneers. Markers have been placed throughout the state with many placed in the 1930s.



Markers honoring patriots who founded Oregon's 1843 Provisional Government at Champoege were some of the early markers. Other markers pay respect to community founders, historic sites, pioneers, and Native Americans of the Pacific Northwest.

The thirty-seven chapters of the OSSDAR are combining efforts to identify, catalog and present new and existing markers and monuments to the public as they carry on their tradition to honor and preserve the history of the State of Oregon.

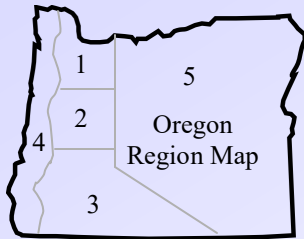
